From the Rector

Dear Friends in Christ,

I'm writing this letter on December 10th, in advance of our <u>Angelus</u> publication deadline, but you won't read it until close to the New Year. The area is wonderfully paralyzed by three inches of snow. I'm sitting in my office – I'm the only one here – looking at the sunshine outside, and a mostly clear South Washington Street. Once again, where possible, folks have opted into an invitation to experience transcendence in the form of a winter weather event. It is indeed mysterious and joyful to feel yourself in the grip of something that is bigger than you are, and to give yourself over to it.

We are headed into January, and the season of Epiphany – a season of light, with all the childhood wonder of new possibilities on the horizon – and we are bidden to follow the stars!

I thought I'd share just a few miscellaneous musings with you. It was a joy to be at the Church of the Epiphany in Washington on Saturday the 8th of December, and to present our friend and brother George Wong to be ordained a deacon. This is the penultimate step in a journey that George began several years ago, and which will be realized fully when, God willing, George will be ordained a priest in June at the Cathedral. We had a great representation from Christ Church there on the 8th, and I know that George feels very affirmed and supported by our congregation. The work of raising up a person to enter the ordained ministry is shared by all of us – and as I offer George my heartiest congratulations, I also thank each of you for your part you've played – it takes a village!

Speaking of "it takes a village", I want to update you on our **stewardship campaign**, "Living by Faith". At this writing, we are at 79% of realizing our pledge income goal for 2014. There are a number of individuals and families who have not yet made their pledge, and they will have received a friendly reminder and invitation letter by the time you read this issue of the <u>Angelus</u>. If you are among those who have never pledged, or have not yet renewed a pledge, now is the time to do so! For renewals, an increase is welcomed. You can make a significant difference in our strength as a parish for this new year. If we cannot make our goal, it will be necessary to make modifications in our programmatic ministries, most particularly in outreach, children's and youth ministries, and music. Together, we can follow the stars, but it takes <u>all</u> of us to make the journey. Thanks to all who will help us!

January is also timely for another important reminder. Our Book of Common Prayer offers this rubric on p. 445:

The Minister of the Congregation is directed to instruct the people, from time to time, of the duty of all Christian parents to make prudent provisions for the well-being of their families, and of all persons to make wills, while they are in health, arranging for the disposal of their temporal goods, not neglecting, if they are able, to leave bequests for religious and charitable purposes.

Do you have a will? Do you have advance directives for health care decisions? And, have you ever considered making a bequest to Christ Church? In 2010, we received a bequest from the estate of the late Jack Oxley, lifelong member of Christ Church, which was unrestricted. That gift was used to purchase the new security system for our church building, which Jack loved, and to contribute toward new computers and a network for our Parish House. This is just one example of how your gift, no matter how large or small, can be received with thanksgiving and then contribute greatly to the well-being and life of our church.

I'm happy to report that our Korean congregation, while small in number, continues to thrive with the generous support of its members, and with the ongoing support of the Korean Episcopal Church. We are glad that the Diocese of Washington is sponsoring Fr. Choi and his family to obtain permanent residential status, which will happen soon. Also, plans are underway for the Chois to begin living next door to the church in the Hillstrom House, which for many years has served as a rental property. The Diocese of Seoul will contribute the funding for the family's residency, which will take the place of the proceeds that we have realized from renters in the past. Since this will no longer be a rental property, we will ultimately not have property taxes to pay or the necessity of having a rental agent. This will be a "win-win" situation for both Christ Church and for Fr. Athanasius and his family.

Well, I think I will shuffle off somewhere to do some Christmas shopping. The stores ought to be less busy, with snow fever engulfing the populace.

This letter comes with my every wish that you will have a blessed Christmas, and a happy, healthy, and hope-filled New Year! Let us follow the stars.

Every Monday night for the past 12 years, Christ Church has played host to a group of our neighbors who would like to speak English more clearly. This year, Pleiades spoke about how her grandparents, originally from Japan, ended up working in the sugar fields in Brazil. Luda, from Russia, shared with us wonderful stories about the long journeys on horseback she took as a child. Haoua, from Mali, told us about how she struggled in school because it was taught in French, a language she didn't speak at home.

Our students have become like a family, sharing the challenges of leaving children, parents, and friends in their country and finding jobs and making new friends here. We get to share the good parts too, like when a student finds a new, better paying job, or is able to bring a parent to the US for a visit or, best of all, finally gets a green card.



A Message from Scrooge...about Lent

As you read this, you might have just donned your stocking cap and settled down for a little holiday reading before drifting into a restful slumber.

I envy you. I can't go to sleep tonight until Jacob Marley's annual visit is over. Ahhh, right on cue: the telltale clanging of chains and mournful moaning.

"Oooooooh! Scrooge...you will be visited only by one spirit this year. (Budget sequesters. Don't ask.)"

A frigid breeze swirls about my room as the Ghost of Future Fasting appears before me. He points a bony finger at the 2014 calendar already hanging on my wall. I adjust my glasses. He's pointing at March 5th.
