From the Rector

Are you a member of Christ Church?

Dear Friends in Christ,

I'm writing my January greeting to you just a couple of days after our Welcoming Committee had a delightful reception for all newcomers to our church. I want to thank all of you who attended, old and new alike – from my perspective, there was a warm and welcoming glow in the Murdock Room that morning!

The reception served to remind me that each year in January, the rectors of all Episcopal churches receive a directive from the National Church and their respective dioceses to complete a form that is called the Parochial Report. The Report is a summary of data on membership, the number of services conducted during the previous year, the average Sunday attendance, the number of private Eucharists observed, the financial status of the congregation, and other matters as well.

I must tell you that the most challenging part of the Report for me each year is the membership category. We are required to count all persons who are active (i.e., they show up at church at least three times a year) baptized members of the congregation. We are also supposed to report all communicants in good standing "who have been faithful in corporate worship...and in working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God." (from the Constitution and Canons of the Episcopal Church). We also report the number of other persons whose baptisms are not recorded in the Parish Register, or in another Episcopal congregation. The confusing part of all of this is that we have some faithful, active, contributing parishioners at Christ Church who, strange as it may sound, are not actually members of the church! This becomes painfully revealed each year at our Parish Annual Meeting, when a list of members eligible to vote at the Meeting is published, and certain people discover to their surprise and disappointment that they are not included on the list. How do you become a member of Christ Church? You are a member if you were baptized at this church and never transferred your membership to another congregation. You are a member if you were baptized at another Episcopal church or other Protestant church, and formally arranged to have your membership transferred to us. You are a member if you were formerly Roman Catholic or Orthodox, or a member of a non-American church in the world-wide Anglican communion, and were made a member by declaration – meaning that you presented a certificate of your baptism to us. You are a member if you were baptized in a different church and are confirmed or formally received into our fellowship by the Bishop.

If you have never done any of the above, you are technically <u>not a member of our church</u> –even if you show up every Sunday, and contribute financially and in our life of ministry. I wish this were all simpler, but those are the rules, according to our church canon law.

There is good news, however. We stand by to help you in any way we can to help you formally process your membership at this church. Please contact Judith Schneider in the office if you have a question about membership (jschneider@cecrockville.org, or 301-762-2191), and we will help in any way we can. You can help us if you've come from another church by being sure to tell them that you have left, and to arrange a letter of transfer. And in the coming months, I will lead a Saturday morning class for three weeks in order to prepare adults and older teens that would like to prepare for baptism, confirmation, or reception – those dates will be announced soon. This might well be a new year in which we can together work on what I will call "the membership project". Please also know that we have a new brochure on membership, which covers the basic information shared in this letter.

Finally, I'd like to mention that we were just notified of a small bequest coming to our church from the estate of a recently deceased parishioner. As we begin a New Year together, it is timely to ask yourself the question: have I remembered Christ Church in my will? If you love this church, you can leave a gift that keeps on giving after you have departed this life. We're always grateful for the generosity and thoughtfulness of our friends as they remember us.

May you each have a happy and healthy New Year!

Inside Outreach

An update from the Christ Church Outreach Committee

Diocesan Hunger Fund

What do breakfasts at Charlie's Place and Kwanzaa Kitchen; lunches at Loaves and Fishes; dinners at Shepherd's Table; and bags of groceries from Seabury Resources for the Aging; and the We Are Family Senior Outreach Network all have in common? Here's the answer: They are all prepared with food funded this year in part by the Hunger Fund of the Episcopal Diocese of Washington. These and many other programs funded by the Diocesan Hunger Fund provide groceries and meals to people who would go to bed hungry without them.

Our Diocesan Hunger Fund was established in the mid-1970s under Bishop Walker with the purpose of providing financial assistance to organizations combating hunger within our Diocese. Forty years later, it is still dedicated to that task. Since January 2009, eighteen organizations have received a total of almost \$80,000 from the Hunger Fund in the form of grants ranging from \$750 to \$5,000. Grants are approved only when there is assurance that the funds will be used for the purpose of purchase of food. A member of the Diocesan Hunger Fund Committee is assigned as a monitor for each grant.

Christ Church supports the Hunger Fund in a number of ways. For the past several years, the youth group has hosted the annual fundraising Hunger Walk at Lake Needwood for the Fund. In addition, Father McDuffie has put on a Jazz Vespers to raise money for the Hunger Fund. The Outreach Committee makes an annual grant to the Fund out of its regular budget, and Rebecca Browning sits on the Hunger Fund Committee as a representative for Region 4. As you can see, the Diocesan Hunger Fund truly is our fund and our opportunity to join with the rest of the Diocese in meeting a need that, sadly, is still real after forty years.

The Outreach Committee meets the second Monday of every other month at 7:30 p.m. in the Parish House. The next meeting will be Monday, November 9th. All are welcome to attend and learn more about the opportunities to live our faith through service to those who need us most. - Ate a little too much over the holidays and need to cut back? Try this delicious, healthy, and low calorie main course. Baked Tilapia with Tomatoes & Olives
- 6 Tilapia fillets
- Salt to taste
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup extra-virgin olive oil
- 4 sprigs fresh thyme
- 3 tomatoes, peeled, seeded & chopped

- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup coarsely chopped green olives
- $\frac{1}{4}$ teaspoon dried hot red pepper flakes
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup finely chopped red onion
- 1 tablespoon fresh lime juice

Lightly oil a shallow baking dish large enough to hold fillets in one layer. Line fillets skin side down. Salt as desired. In a bowl, combine olive oil, thyme, tomatoes, olives, pepper flakes, garlic, onions and lime juice. Spoon tomato mixture over fillets. Bake uncovered at 400° in middle rack of oven for 15-20 minutes, or until fish flakes.
