From the Rector



Dear Friends in Christ,

One of my favorite Lenten hymns in the 1982 Hymnal is one that we almost never sing. I think it is because it's just too cheery! It is Hymn 145; the tune is <u>Quittez</u>, <u>Pasteurs</u>, on old French Christmas carol. It's in the key of Eb major. Check out the first two verses:

Now quit your care and anxious fear and worry; for schemes are vain and fretting brings no gain. Lent calls to prayer, to trust and dedication; God brings new beauty nigh; Reply, reply, reply with love to love most high; Reply, reply, reply with love to love most high.

To bow the head in sackcloth and in ashes,

Or rend the soul, such grief is not Lent's goal;

But to be led to where God's glory flashes,

His beauty to come near.

Make clear, make clear, make clear where truth and love appear;

Make clear, make clear, make clear where truth and love appear.

How's your Lent going so far? And how might you be led to where God's glory flashes? If giving up chocolate or Martinis helps you to do that, then it is well and good. But if not, consider something else.

Recently I presented an Adult Forum series called "What? Me an Evangelist?", which was an effort to invite us to think of evangelism in a new and helpful key. A lot of you didn't attend the Forum – some of you may have thought, "Thank God I don't have to think about stuff like that!" But the real stuff of the Forum, based on a book by David Gortner called <u>Transforming Evangelism</u>, was an encouragement for us to grow in the spiritual discipline of cultivating gratitude in our lives. Gortner reminds us that people who have been to a great

movie or eaten at a great restaurant are typically excited, and have an overwhelming desire to share their excitement with others. Evangelism is much the same. If we can begin to recognize the wonderful ways in which we encounter God over and over again in our lives, we will find a compelling desire to share our wonder, our awe, and our thanksgiving with others and invite them to share the special holy moments of their lives with us.

Lent is traditionally a time for recognizing and working through some of the barriers that keep us from God – and if we can cultivate a deeper way of recognizing the presence of the Holy One in our lives, then our gratitude may abound. You might find yourself spending some time each morning in Lent simply asking yourself, "Where is God going to show up for me today?", and in the evening, reflecting on where you saw God at work. We live in an increasingly secular world, in which many people don't feel a need to come through our church doors on Sunday morning. But God is out in the world – "Christ plays in ten thousand places", Gerard Manley Hopkins once wrote, and the more we are attuned to this, the deeper our faith and the sharing of our faith.

This is how I'm trying to spend my Lent – joyfully, with wonder and awe, and led to where God's glory flashes. I invite you to join me! May each of us be blessed as we continue to make the journey to Holy Week and Easter.
