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From the Rector



Dear Friends in Christ,

Welcome to the September issue of the <u>Angelus</u>, as we begin another programmatic year at Christ Church. I hope that you all have had spacious times this summer for rest and renewal, and that you will join us for our Back-to-Fall special service on **Sunday**, **September 8**th, at 10:00 a.m. We will have our annual Blessing of School Backpacks that morning, so I want to encourage all of our school children to bring their backpacks. We will also gather together for lunch after the service, at an event hosted by the Fellowship Committee. After the 8th...well, it's back into the fall season in full swing on September 15th, with our regular three-service-schedule, Sunday School registration, and an adult ministries fair hosted by our Adult Christian Formation Committee.

Mark your calendars for another special liturgy in late September. On **Sunday, September 29th, at 3:00 p.m.,** we will have our annual **Blessing of the Animals** service in Foley Park next to the church driveway. Please bring dogs on leashes, and cats and other animals in suitable travel containers. Young children may bring their stuffed animals for a blessing as well. In the event of rain, we'll gather in the Chapel space in our church building.

Finally, I'd like to bring up a study series called <u>The Story</u>, which is being promoted by our Diocese. The series is divided into 31 segments, and it is designed to give participants an understanding of the overarching narrative themes and structure of the entire Bible. Bishop Mariann has commented that while Episcopalians are among the most highly educated Christians in the country, we are also among the most biblically illiterate. This study can be undertaken individually, and you can read Biblical passages each week and think about the study questions that are asked after each section – they will be posted on the Diocesan webpage. Or, better yet, I would like to see if we could generate a study group that could meet weekly, perhaps during the early evening hours, and do the study together. Please let me know if you would be interested in such a group. On September 22nd I will present a Sunday Forum on <u>The Story</u>, and see what interest we might generate. I can say proudly that I consider Christ Church to be one of the finest churches in the Diocese of Washington, and I look forward to a new year with you all!

HOPE IN SOUTH AFRICA

Hope in South Africa (HISA) is a partnership that began in 2005 between St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Poolesville, MD and the community of Richmond, South Africa. Through the active support of Christ Church, Rotary Clubs on both continents, and many other resource partners, HISA has grown in size, scope, and breadth of its ministry. The principal aim of the programs sponsored by HISA is to nurture youth to reach adulthood as healthy, responsible, and contributing citizens and leaders in their racially and culturally diverse communities. From programs focused on the prevention of devastating diseases, such as HIV/AIDS and Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders, to the creation of a community center with children's recreational programs, a soup kitchen and kitchen garden providing fresh vegetables for nourishing, free meals for the children, HISA works steadily and successfully to build healthy futures. The financial and in-kind support of the Christ Church community is an essential part of this mission.

On Saturday, October 19th, HISA will bring a celebration of its ministry to Maryland with its annual Sundowners Picnic, from Noon until 7:00 p.m. at Lock Overlook Farm, 20500 Martinsburg Rd., Dickerson MD 20842. Please plan to join the fun, make new friends, and take advantage of the opportunity to help fight poverty, one small step at a time. Highlights include live music by Brian Keith Gross, Brooke Robbins and Friends. NEWS FROM COMMUNITY MINISTRIES OF ROCKVILLE

Community Ministries of Rockville (CMR) is a faith-based organization that seeks to improve the quality of life of the most vulnerable residents in Montgomery County through the Mansfield Kaseman Health Clinic; the Rockville Emergency Assistance Program (REAP); the Language Outreach Program (LOP); the Elderly Ministries Program; and Jefferson House. Through the Outreach Committee, Christ Church provides monthly funding to CMR to support its direct service programs.

The **Kaseman Health Clinic** is now open four days a week. The clinic currently provides primary medical care, as well as specialty services in the areas of orthopedics, endocrinology, podiatry, and dermatology.

CMR welcomes Leann Sherman as its new Program Director for the Elderly Ministries Program.

CMR's Latino Outreach Program is now the **Language Outreach Program (LOP)**. Registration is now open for the next session of language and literacy classes. Classes begin on September 10th.

Rockville Rewards will kick off on September 12th. The discount cards will be sold for a special price of \$15 on that day. Volunteers and staff from CMR will be selling the cards at three local restaurants on 9/12: El Mariachi restaurant; the Bean Bag Deli and Catering Company; and the Woodside Deli.

CMR needs volunteers: LOP needs teacher assistants and tutors on Tuesday and Thursday nights. CMR and the Kaseman Clinic need office assistants during business hours.

THE MUSICAL SCOOP FROM DENVER

This past June and July, shortly after school ended, I had the privilege of attending the annual conference of the Association of Anglican Musicians (AAM) in Denver and Colorado Springs. Over 250 Episcopal organists, choir directors, and clergy from across the country gathered for a week of worship, recitals, and professional concerns. This was a rare opportunity to network with the most creative minds in Episcopal liturgy and with the most experienced musicians in this specialized field.

The churches we visited had a visual beauty and live acoustic, which invited us to meet the Divine in worship. Soaring arches and richly colored windows drew our eyes forward to the altar. Reverberant sound gave authority to the readings and new life to the singing of congregation and choir. This was made possible by the abundance of hard reflective surfaces of stone, plaster, and wood, and the total absence of absorbent surfaces like carpet, drapes, and cushions. In most cases, ceilings were left open to the very apex of the roof, and the exposed beams provided beautiful patterns in contrast to the larger white panels in the space above. A number of the Gothic buildings we visited had recently undergone renovations to improve the acoustics for the Liturgy, and significant organ installations or renovations were the order of the day.

We were grandly and warmly hosted in worship at such great churches as St Andrew's (a Ralph Adams Cram building) and St. John's Cathedral in Denver, and Grace and St. Stephen's and the Air Force Academy Cadet Chapel in Colorado Springs. We worshiped twice a day, heard exquisite choral singing, and were inspired by the preaching of The Rev. Barbara Cawthorne Crafton, who clearly knew the daily scriptures, and how they might specifically relate to the gathered congregation of organists and choir directors.

Professional Concerns sessions dealt with topics like "Engaging Technology: A Survey of Tools that Help Church Musicians", "Music, Liturgy, and Church Growth in the Culture of the 21st Century", and "How to take your Choir to England". Informal chats with colleagues often started with questions: "How are you dealing with X, Y, and Z?" or "What music have you found to match the readings for February 16^h in Year A?" I was pleased to discover that a number of parishes had Chorister programs akin to ours at Christ Church, and across the board, parishes had at least eight adult "staff singers".

A few special bonuses for me were the opportunity to play on an historic 1869 Hook organ, originally built for a church in Boston, but now living at the Cathedral in Denver. The warm, yet powerful sounds emanating from the pipes, combined with the smoothness of the keyboards' mechanical action were a revelation. I also had the opportunity to hear the bells of the carillon at the University of Denver. Most sets of bells like these are housed in church towers, but this tower was positioned over the ice hockey arena!

I am grateful for the opportunity to attend the annual AAM conferences for information and inspiration. With the vestry's continued support, I look forward to the conferences in Washington DC in 2014 (I serve on the planning committee), in Tampa in 2015, and in England in 2016.
