From the Rector

Dear Friends in Christ,

As I write this letter to you, I find myself in the middle of a busy September, and thought I would share with you some of our recent office and parish news.

I came back from vacation to meet several sad transitional moments. Our parishioner Daniel Garcia-Beech, the 13-year-old boy who had bone cancer, and whom we had prayed for almost two years, died on August 28th. Dan bore his illness with inspiring courage and dignity, and we celebrated his life at a service on September 4th, which was well-attended by those who knew and loved him. My thanks to our hard-working Fellowship Committee, who organized a beautiful reception. At the funeral service, we invited people to make a donation to support an organization helping children with osteosarcoma. It is called M.I.B (Make it Better for Osteosarcoma) Agents. If you would like to make a donation in Daniel's memory, you can go to www.mibagents.org.

Several days before my return from vacation, Michael Hinds, former Vestry member and beloved parishioner, died from pancreatic cancer, which was both swift and aggressive, and left us all shocked and surprised. Our hearts go out to Michael's wife Amy Ellis, and sons David and Andrew. We will have a celebration of Michael's life on **Saturday, October 8th, at 11:00 a.m.,** followed by a reception.

I also discovered shortly before coming back that Tad Cavuoti, our director of music, was taken seriously ill from complications related to diabetes, and was hospitalized for a second time this summer. Tad has recently been transferred to a rehabilitation facility, and we anticipate a lengthy time of convalescence. As we await further developments regarding Tad's recovery, I have been able to secure the services of James Walton for our Sunday services through the end of October. Jim is recently retired as the organist and choirmaster at St, Martin in the Fields Episcopal Church in Severna Park, and he worked with me for three years while I served as the rector of St. Dunstan's Church in Bethesda. He is a fine church musician. As the weeks progress, we will have to carefully evaluate Tad's health and determine what his length of recovery will be.

Also, just before returning, I found out that Maggie Schneider, who had been our office assistant for almost two years, was leaving us to go work full-time at Christ Episcopal School as their front desk person. Maggie has been a bright and cheerful presence in the Parish House, and we will miss her. But I'm glad to report that we were able to find a capable successor to Maggie in a speedy fashion. Penelope Johnson started with us on Friday, September 9th. She is a former church parish administrator who is happy at this point in her life to no longer supervise others, but to work parttime as a support person. Welcome, Penelope!

In the midst of change, which is one of the realities of living, it is still good for me to realize once again what a special place Christ Church is. On September 1st, I observed the 18th anniversary of my first day as your Rector, and I'm thankful for the privilege I have of serving here. We are a community of the beloved of God, and I feel this every time I come to work, as well as worship with you on Sunday. We also have, as an arm of our mission to the community, a wonderful parish day school. Christ Episcopal School is observing its fiftieth anniversary this school year, and I give thanks for its rich history and place in our collective spiritual life as we move forward in faith.

I invite you to give thanks to almighty God for the life of our church, and one way to do this is by coming to one of our three services on **Sunday, October 2nd**. It marks the beginning of our fall stewardship campaign, entitled "Living by Faith", and as usual, our Stewardship Committee has something special to offer you that day in our worship.

An Update on the Christ Church Outreach Program

John 21:17a: "He said to him the third time, 'Simon, son of Jonah, do you love me?"

Feed My Sheep

In the last chapter of the Gospel of John, Jesus asks Peter three times if he loves him. Jesus then tells him each time that because he loves him that he must tend to and feed his sheep. Jesus doesn't say, "Feed my law-abiding clean sheep," but simply "Feed my sheep." This month, we will highlight ways in which many different groups in Christ Church are actively feeding God's sheep. Christ Church, by way of many groups, obeys this command in various ways. The third Sunday of

the month sees many of us trying to feed the hungry through different means. The third Sunday is "Serving Others Sunday" when the youth pack sandwiches for McKenna's Wagon to be given to homeless people on the streets of DC, and when backpacks are filled with food for needy students at Meadow Hall Elementary to eat over the weekend. It is also MANNA food Sunday when non-perishable food is collected for the MANNA food bank. St. Francis Flock, through the CHOMPERS pet food collection program, ensures that pets are not forgotten. Also on the third Sunday, a group of people go to St. Stephen's and the Incarnation Church in Washington D.C. to help serve a hot meal to anywhere from 150-250 people. Christ Church is also a big participant in the Diocesan Hunger Fund Walk in October.



We also package thousands of meals (and have a great time doing it!) through the yearly Stop Hunger Now event. This year, Stop Hunger Now will be held Saturday, November 19th from 10:00 a.m. to Noon at the church. Join us to help us feed God's sheep. What better way to begin the week of Thanksgiving, than to help pack 15,000 meals and help stop world hunger! More info to come, and we look forward to seeing you there.
