From the Rector

Dear Friends in Christ,

If you were with us in worship Sunday, October 1st, you will recall that we kicked off our fall stewardship campaign, "A New Heart and a New Spirit", which is a phrase that is recurrent in the book of the prophet Ezekiel. And, as has been our custom for many years, the Stewardship Committee of Christ Church assisted me in the sermon that morning, as we presented a skit with songs written to amuse us, inform us, and inspire us to be generous in our financial pledges of support.

This past week I had a flashback moment as I recalled the first stewardship song I ever shared with Christ Church. It was Sunday, October 3rd 1999, and the stewardship campaign theme that year was "A Winning Team". When I came to Christ Church in 1998, I learned that there was an old myth that circulated during stewardship appeals – which was, in effect, that no one had to worry about supporting the church because there was a handful of well-off families who ran the place and contributed all the necessary funds.

Although this was an appealing myth, and may have accurately reflected the financial life of the congregation in years past, it was certainly no longer the way things were toward the turn of the twenty-first century. Our stewardship appeal was based on the premise that all of us were needed to provide support and ministry in the church – using a sports analogy, all of us were needed to contribute to be a "winning team". That Sunday, I got up in the pulpit, doffed a baseball cap, and sang, "Take Me Out to Christ Church, Now..." sung to the tune of "Take Me Out to the Ballgame." (Sadly, I don't remember the rest of the song lyrics, and I can't find them anywhere!)

That "winning team" analogy became the ground for several more stewardship campaigns that followed, including the 2004 campaign "Get Off the Bench and Be a Player", which featured a song written to "Cheer, Cheer, For Old Notre Dame". It began, "Christ Church has got a great team, / We are the players, living God's dream..."

I've continued to like the image of a winning team during my years of ministry at Christ Church. And I was especially heartened when my friend and Hebrew scholar the Rev. Dr. Hemchand Gossai told me that "a new heart and a new spirit" could also be translated from the Hebrew as "one heart and one spirit." Doesn't that sound like a winning team? Allow me to present to you again what I wrote for the November 1999 issue of the Angelus:

If the sports analogy is too much of a stretch for your theological imagination, I invite you to ponder the original Christian version of "a winning team". It is in the language of our Creeds, and we call it "the communion of saints." The saints are all the baptized people of God: those who have gone before us, those who are with us now, and those who are to come after us. Saints are not necessarily defined as men and women who have provided extraordinary witness to the faith, although that is how certain individuals have come to be canonized, and how we typically think of our saints. But in fact, in many of his letters to churches, St. Paul begins with the greeting, "...to all, who are called to be the saints (emphasis mine)..." The Greek word is hagios, and it means not only "consecrated" or "holy" but also as a noun "one of God's people." In a recent sermon, I mentioned that all of us bear the image of God, and hence we are all God's people.

One of the central mysteries of Christian worship is contained in our creedal formula about this communion of saints. We believe that in a wonderful way <u>all time</u> – past, present, and future – is gathered into the present when we encounter God in the sacramental liturgy of the Church. And that means that every time we are together at Christ Church, we are surrounded by the whole faithful cloud of witnesses, who are there to pray for us and with us, and to sustain us. That is truly a winning team!

The first Sunday in November is All Saints' Sunday, and it is a day set apart especially to celebrate this wonderful sacred mystery. As one of my colleagues once said, "Forget those Hallmark Card Sundays which we observe in May and June; All Saint's Day is the Church's Mothers' Day and Father's Day." And not only that – it is also the day to welcome those who are to come after us, and who are new to the wondrous communion as we baptize them.

I hope that you will feel a special joy in being on this winning team as we gather on All Saints' Sunday on November 5th, and that this joy will continue on November 12th as we bless your financial pledges on our Fall Pledge Ingathering Sunday. Truly, we are, together with God's help, all the saints of God, with a new heart and a new spirit that becomes one heart and one spirit.

Thanksgiving Day Service



Christ Church will have its annual Thanksgiving Day service on November 23rd at 10:00 a.m. The offering that day will go to the Residential Emergency Assistance Program (R.E.A.P.) of Community Ministries of Rockville, which helps Rockville families with various emergent needs. In a busy day devoted to friends, family, and feasting, we hope that you can make time to gather and to give thanks to God, the giver of all our gifts.

Interested in Scheduling a Baptism at Christ Church?

We're excited about our growing families at Christ Church, and the new arrivals of babies! I want to share again our parish policy for scheduling baptisms. We follow the directions in our Book of Common Prayer, on p. 312:

Holy Baptism is especially appropriate at the Easter Vigil, on the Day of Pentecost, on All Saints Day or the Sunday after All Saints Day, and on the Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord (the First Sunday after the Epiphany). It is recommended that, as far as possible, Baptisms be reserved for these occasions or when a bishop is present.

Our next occasion for baptism is the Sunday after All Saints Day (this year, on November 5th). The First Sunday after the Epiphany falls on January 7th, 2018; the Easter Vigil is on Saturday evening, March 31st; and the day of Pentecost will be May 20th.

From June through early September, families may negotiate with the rector in finding a Sunday that will be mutually suitable for them, and for the church's schedule. If you would like to schedule a baptism, please contact Fr. McDuffie for further instructions.



<u>Inside Outreach</u>

An Update on the Christ Church Outreach Program

"Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?' "The King will reply, Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."- Matthew 25:37-40

Our annual Rise Against Hunger event will take place in the Parish Dining Room on Saturday, November 18th from 10:00 - Noon. Plan to arrive a little early to get registered and settled in for this great event!

Formerly named Stop Hunger Now, the Rise Against Hunger event has been a fantastic expression of outreach within our church each year. We typically have about 50 people show up and package more than 15,000 meals in the two-hour period, and the group represents a great cross-section of church parishioners.

Rise Against Hunger is an international hunger relief organization that distributes food and life-changing aid to the world's most vulnerable, mobilizing the necessary resources to end hunger by 2030. The meals we packed last year were sent to Haiti, and we received the following information about that shipment:

Your shipment is on its way to three partner organizations working together in Northern Haiti: The Robert Ford Haitian School and Orphanage Foundation, Hands for Haiti, and College John Wesley. All three partners focus on sustainable community development and ensure that their programs are effectively run and "owned" by the communities they benefit. The Robert Ford Foundation serves a variety of needs in the profoundly impoverished Grison-Garde community. More than 700 school students receive a free education and daily meal and 50 orphaned children receive daily care and food. Hands for Haiti is the sole means of financial support for The Solidarity School in Tremesse Village, Haiti that serves 230 children. It was founded on the belief that education is the key to breaking the cycle of poverty. The College John Wesley in Cap-Haitien provides an education to 350 children in primary and secondary school. With many needs and few resources, these children have a difficult time concentrating in school because of hunger. Your meals will not only fill their bellies but allow them the opportunity to learn effectively.

We hope to see everyone there this year and have included sign up information below: Please join us on November 18th by filling out this sheet and dropping it in the Offering plate, or e-mailing David Craig at david@spacesaverVA.com. A suggested donation to the Outreach general budget (please make checks out to CEC with "SHN" in the memo line) is: \$50 per family, \$25 per adult, and \$15 for youths 16 and older who participate on their own.


