## News From Our Senior Warden

Fellow Christ Church Voyagers – We are coming to the end of a nearly year-long voyage. Fr. McDuffie retired a year ago the end of January, and we have spent the time since then searching for a new rector, while trying to maintain the atmosphere of welcoming and love that characterizes Christ Church. We have had ups and downs, and things haven't always gone quite the way we expected, but as we near the end of our voyage, I think I can say we have survived it remarkably well. That I can say this is due to a lot of hard work and dedication by many amazing people. Our Search Committee, chaired by Janice Musselman, hit the ground running the day after Fr. McDuffie left. They met almost every Monday evening from the end of January until the middle of October when they presented a list of candidates to the Vestry. They held focus groups, listened to the congregation, prepared a profile of our wants and needs, interviewed candidates, visited candidates to hear them preach, and generally did an incredible job of honing the applicants down to three stellar candidates. The congregation owes a huge debt of thanks to Dave Craig, Barbara Fennelly, Honore Kaseya, Susan Lin, Emily Pearce, Lynn Posorske, Steve Renfroe, Jim Suit, Mark Wright, and of course, Janice Musselman.

As soon as the short list of candidates was presented to the Vestry, this wonderful group of people cleared their calendars so that the candidates could be interviewed as quickly as possible (and these were multi-day interviews) and a discernment process could begin. As you all hopefully know by now, a call has been made to a new rector, and this call has been accepted. We are not able to announce more about our new rector until early January, but rest assured that this was a unanimous decision by the Vestry who believe that the individual selected is the ideal person to lead Christ Church into our future. As soon as we are able to announce our new Rector, the Transition Committee will take over and prepare to welcome the rector to Christ Church. Amy Ellis is chairing this committee comprised of Joyce Bryant, Peter Heister, Emily Krebs Davis, Megan Mossman, and Allison Roulier. They will be calling on various committees and individuals as needed in this endeavor. Thanks, in advance, to this great group of people as well.

Throughout our entire journey, we have had as a guiding presence, the Reverend Cindy Simpson. She has tirelessly assumed the additional ministerial duties that fell to her in the absence of a rector, and even during the interim period, carried a more than full load. Her joyful presence, her enthusiastic sermons, and her enveloping pastoral care kept us grounded even during periods of unsettling change. To many, the Sundays on which she preached became known as Cindy Sundays. During the first part of the year, and again from now until the new rector starts, she has been and will be assisted by the Rev. Peter Bastien and the Rev. Dr. Hemchand Gossai, preachers much loved by our congregation. And while Cindy kept our liturgical processes moving forward, Michele Craig kept our youth programs robust, and Judith Schneider maintained our office on an even keel. And recently, Jason West has insured that our music program remains strong and that our choir expands its reach. Thank you to all these wonderful people.

As I mentioned, things didn't always go as we expected. We didn't get an interim rector here as soon as we had planned, and once we did, that tenure did not last as long as we had

originally intended. We lost a long-time staff member. Change came on us too fast and furious for us to appreciate or adapt to. And yet, we have not only survived, but fared pretty well, I think. We hope that people who stayed away for various reasons will come back to welcome our new rector. We hope that people who have not pledged for various reasons will once again feel the call to support the church in all that it does. I personally am grateful for having had this opportunity to serve Christ Church. It has been an exhausting adventure and one that I hope never to have to repeat, but I give thanks to you, the parishioners of Christ Church, who make it all worthwhile.

David Clough, On Animals: Theological Ethics**



We are thrilled to announce our next upcoming speaker! David Clough, Professor of Theological Ethics at the University of Chester in England, will be joining us on February 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2019, immediately following the 9:00 a.m. service for the Adult Forum. Here is an idea of the kind discussion we will enjoy – From David's keynote speech at the Sarx Creature Conference (March 2017): *Animals: So Who Cares?*

“Who cares? Sometimes it seems like no one does, based on how we treat them. Who cares? Sometimes it seems like everyone, from the popularity of kitten pictures on Facebook, from how many people invest time, trouble, and money in companion animals, and giving to animal charities. Who cares? Often it seems that it is secular animal groups that lead on animal issues, such as the RSPCA, or PETA, inspired by the atheistic utilitarianism of Peter Singer, or Tom Regan or Gary Francione's animal rights theory.

So what about Christians? Well, there's plenty of evidence of caring about particular animals, just like everyone else, but animals are not prominent among current faith concerns. Few Christians seem to think of concern for animals as a faith issue. I think we tend to think of animals in the same category as soap operas, or Game of Thrones, or

football, or your guilty pleasure of choice, we love them, but we don't connect them to our faith, and don't expect to hear about them in church. We confess faith in Jesus Christ, and we love animals, but we don't often put the two together. And this situation seems very odd to me, because there are strong biblical and theological reasons to care about animals.” If you would like to learn more about David, please check out **CreatureKind** ([www.becreaturekind.org](http://www.becreaturekind.org)), an organization he formed to work with churches to foster new ways of thinking about animals in the context of Christian faith. #### **January 13<sup>th</sup> – "Reclaiming Jesus," part 2 – with The Rev. Peter Bastien**

We live in complicated and difficult times for the Church in terms of our relations with the political order. How do we as a Church respond when the secular state does things that violate Christian ethical and social norms? In this second session, we will look at The Boston Declaration, a document in which Christian leaders, bishops, and theologians have tried to address these concerns. We will also look at the history of the Confessing Church in Germany during the Third Reich and also at the Lutheran doctrine of *status confessionis*. Finally, we'll briefly examine next steps – how we can join hands with non-Christian people (Jews, Muslims, Buddhists, Humanists, etc.) to work for a world where Peace and Justice are the norm.

Don't miss this session with our favorite, astute Lutheran colleague! Peter and wife Pat are beloved parishioners, worshiping with us when he is not preaching or teaching in other congregations.

Hemchand currently serves as Associate Dean of Humanities and Social Sciences at the Annandale campus of the Northern Virginia Community College. 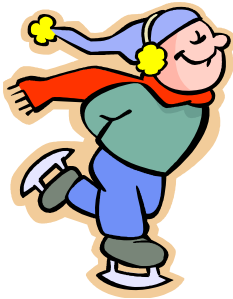
